The O. C. Barber Creamery is located approximately 200 feet east of Barn No. 1. The concrete datestone on the south end of the building clearly attests to its former owner and present age, as it reads "O. C. B. 1909".

The Creamery is best described as having a long rectangular section running east to west with a smaller square section attached to the southwest side of the building. It is this square section that housed the dairykeeper and his family. The long rectangular section of the Creamery contains two rooms. The room in the east section of the Creamery was used for bottling, while the room in the west section of the Creamery was used for distribution. On the extreme west side of this section were large doors through which both milk trucks and milk wagons were loaded.

The Creamery is, like all of the other Anna Dean Farm buildings, made of brick and trimmed with concrete block. Mr. Barber had a great eye for symmetry and beauty and the Creamery was the only building in which different shades of red brick were used. Probably not pleased with the effect, Barber built the other Anna Dean Farm buildings using only red brick. The living quarters of the Creamery have 12 rooms on two floors. Entrance to the rest of the Creamery cannot be made through these living quarters.

The two dairy rooms are both one story high and are connected by a large set of interior doors. The dairy section of the Creamery has rather large unusual outside windows. These windows, about 8 feet high, are actually three separate sets of windows mounted on different tracks. Any or all of these three sections could be opened to provide a breeze to cool off the Creamery and, even though there was electricity in the Creamery, these windows provided for natural lighting.

The basement for the Creamery extends only under the living quarters. The basement is odd because it is on three individual levels. The dairy section of the Creamery is built on a slab.

The roof of the Creamery is the hip style roof and the entire roof is covered with red tiles. There are two dormers on the east side of the roof above the living quarters. This building was the second and last building to have wooden overhangs. All the Barber buildings after the Creamery had concrete dentil work instead of overhangs. On the north side of the roof above the living quarters is a skylight that emits sunshine into a second story bathroom. Also on this side of the roof is a brick chimney that is connected to the furnace.

#### 7. Description

The Creamery is in excellent condition inside and outside. It has received great care and does not show its age of 64 years.

#### 8. Significance

he insisted be periodically vacuumed) was poured into a large holding vat. A conveyor moved the milk bottles past the nozzle of the vat, where the bottles were stopped and filled. The conveyor belt then moved them to workers who capped them and sent them on their way. When a bottle reached the end of the line it was in the distrubution room where it was placed on a milk wagon or truck. Barber's milk was bottled in quarts and pints with the cream in 1/2 pints.

When Barber died, in 1920, Western Reserve College turned down his bequeathal of the Anna Dean Farm. It was then split up and sold. The Creamery was sold to the Telling Belle Vernon Company who ran it as a dairy. Later the Creamery was used as a clubhouse for the Anna Dean Golf Course, after which it was sold, along with Barn No. 1, to its present owner.

Om March 27, 1973, the O.C. Barber Carriage House and Apiary were torn down to prevent the city of Barberton from completing their purchase of this land as a park site. They join the Barber Mansion and other farm buildings that were destroyed for short time gains.

Recently the owners of Barn No. 1 and the Creamery were asked to sell their land, razing Barn No. 1 for a senior citizen apartment under the FHA 236 Program. The owner now threatens to have both barn and creamery destroyed. Barn No. 1 was recently placed on the National Register of Historic Places. It is hoped that the Creamery and other remaining O.C. Barber buildings can also gain this honor. The buildings, once part of a single 2000 acre farm, are now quite seperate with roads, playing fields, apartments, etc. between them.


