

## Celebrating 150 Years

Since its founding in 1874, our library has been a cornerstone of the community, fostering a passion for learning, creativity, and connection. To celebrate this milestone, we launched a Passport program, encouraging visits to all 19 library locations and bookmobiles. We also introduced commemorative library cards and tote bags featuring artwork by local artists.

We hosted various anniversary events, including a Community Read. Our Special Collections department curated a digital timeline from our founding to the present day. The celebrations were crowned by a Sesquicentennial Gala, attended by over 350 guests.

As a special anniversary gift, our Library became fine-free on March 1, 2024, the exact date we first opened our doors in 1874.

- 1,376,008 physical items in the Library's collection with access to millions more through SearchOhio and OhioLINK
- 172,238 uses of public computers
- 1,625 U.S. passports processed and 1,537 U.S. passport photos taken (available at Main Library and Nordonia Hills Branch)
- 13,464 after-school snacks provided throughout school year
- 3,428 appointments in the TechZone@Main, with makerspace services like 3D printing, vinyl printing, laser engraving, multimedia recording studios, and more
- 50,394 visitors to three bookmobiles that travelled 13,000 miles
- 1,232,300 items checked out via digital services including Hoopla, Kanopy, and Libby
