


Bildner, Phil. A High Five for Glenn Burke, 2020. JFIC

When someone anonymously posts hateful memes on her school's website, Zenobia knows she's the one with the abilities to solve the mystery, all while wrestling with the challenges of a new school, a new family, and coming to grips with presenting her true gender for the first time.

In a small but turbulent Louisiana town, one boy's grief takes him beyond the bayous of his backyard, to learn that there is no right way to be yourself.




Gino, Alex. Alice Austen Lived Here, 2022. JFIC

When Annabelle learns that her father shares something big--and surprising--in common with her new nonbinary friend, she begins to see herself, and her family, in a whole new light.




Oshiro, Mark. The Insiders, 2021. JFIC

Desperation and chance lead them to the Communion of Blue, an order of magical women who spin the threads of reality to their will. While Hawke wants to return to his old life, Grayce struggles to keep the threads of her new life from unraveling, and realizes she wants to stay in the one place that will allow her to finally live as a girl.
